Key information for the Health and Movement Science Life Skills 11-12 Syllabus

- Schools and teachers use syllabuses to develop educational programs for students.
 2025 will be the last year that the Stage 6 PDHPE Life Skills Syllabus (2012) will be taught in Year 12. Students in Year 11 in 2025 must be studying the <u>Health and Movement</u> Science Life Skills 11-12 Syllabus (2025).
- Focus areas that can be studied throughout Year 11 (120 hours) include 'Health for individuals and communities' and 'The body and mind in motion'.
- The new <u>Health and Movement Science Life</u> Skills 11-12 Syllabus, is digital and formatted in

- this manner for all reform syllabuses. The digital format is interactive and allows for easy navigation. You can filter, search for specific topics, and explore resources directly.
- In addition to the core topics, students may engage in the Collaborative Investigation and/or Depth Studies.
- The Health and Movement Science Life Skills 11-12 Syllabus has a glossary tab that contains information about words specific to the course.

Life Skills eligibility

Life Skills courses are designed for students
with intellectual disability in Years 7–12 who
cannot access stage or prior stage outcomes,
as determined through collaborative curriculum
planning involving the student, parents or carers,
and teachers. They are not suitable for students
without intellectual disability or students who
could meet outcomes with adjustments.

Assessment

- Students must demonstrate achievement of one or more Life Skills outcomes. Schools are required to provide additional support or adjustments to teaching, learning and assessment activities for some students with special education needs.
- Assessments can be flexible, using various options (e.g., written, spoken, visual, assistive technologies) and may be implemented in different learning environments.
- Formal assessment of Life Skills outcomes is not required. More information about assessment can be found in the <u>Health and Movement Science Life</u> <u>Skills 11-12-Assessment</u> tab of the syllabus and the NESA <u>Assessment</u> and reporting webpage.
- Stage 6 Life Skills courses do not have external examinations.

Support materials

The PDHPE Secondary Curriculum 7-12 team provide resources to support NSW teachers in the delivery of the Health and Movement Science Life Skills 11-12 Syllabus. We are in the process of developing curriculum resources to support Life Skills syllabuses. These will be shared via Statewide Staffrooms on their release.
