Our ethos is Yindyamarra Winhanganha – a Wiradjuri phrase meaning 'the wisdom of respectfully knowing how to live well in a world worth living in'.

# How our program works

### Step 1: Apply

Apply to study the degree that's right for you (have a look at the table on the next page). Your offer from us will outline any credit you're eligible for, which could fast-track your study.

### Step 2: Customise

Choose to study full-time or part-time. Decide which Key Learning Areas (KLAs) (Primary) or Teaching Areas (Secondary) you're interested in. For example:

- · Creative arts
- English
- Human society and its environment (Aboriginal Studies, History, Geography, etc.)
- Mathematics
- Personal development, health and physical education
- Science, technology and applied studies

### Step 3: Begin

Start your course. You'll get real-world experience with up to 60 days' work experience towards the end of your degree. Plus you can keep working as an AEO throughout your course.

### Step 4: Advance

If you choose to proceed to your master's degree, you can specialise in the same KLAs as your bachelor's degree – and get credit for the subjects you've already completed. You can work part-time in your final four semesters of study, and may be able to complete your final placement in the school you work in.

### Step 5: Complete

You graduate as a fully qualified primary or secondary school teacher.

### Scholarships and financial advice


### **First Nations Tutor Program**
