For students in NSW schools

Travel training is a learner-centred process, with the goal of promoting independent and safe use of public transport.



Successful travel training requires a practical assessment of a student's skills, motivation and commitment.

Travel training gives students independence and valuable lifelong skills.



Travel training is taught by a trainer who has the knowledge and skills to assess, plan, teach and monitor a travel training program, in the community, for a student with disability.

Travel education can begin at an early age with basic safety rules used by families.





Training is provided to students who do not possess the skills to go from the starting point of a trip to the destination and back.



Students learn their travel route between home and school.
