


- Shoes must be worn at all times by anyone involved in a game. Screw-in studs, hard plastic and metal cleats are not permitted on the diamond.




Explain the steps you will take to make sure the playing area above is safe for the class to use.

Check all the equipment is suitable for play.




- 1) Make sure all the players understand the rules.


1. Clear the area of obstructions and make sure the field is the right size.





You should always wear a helmet while you are batting. You should always wear mitts while out in the playing field. You could really damage your hands if you try to catch a softball without mitts.


Find a suitable playing field. No trees, fences etc.

Make sure that players have required and appropriate safety equipment on.


Clear the grounds and make sure that uneven ground is filled + fixed up.


1. Make sure the batters who are lining up are away from the field so they don't get hit.




Explain the steps you will take to make sure the playing area above is safe for the class to use.







The people who are not playing must not be silly around the field and must not play silly with the equipments as they may be injured.




- 1) put the gear/pads on the catcher
