Who is this resource for?

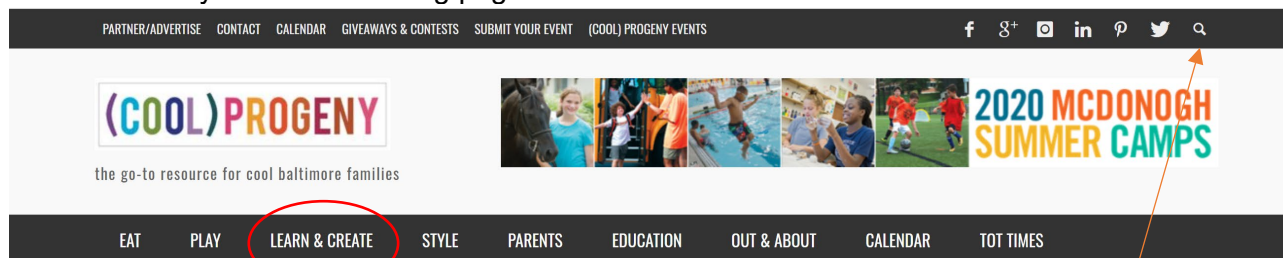
A site that provides information and links to resources for parents. This is a free site. There is no sign up or enrolment necessary.

3. Click on the Learn and Create tab to find the Cool Fun At Home Lessons

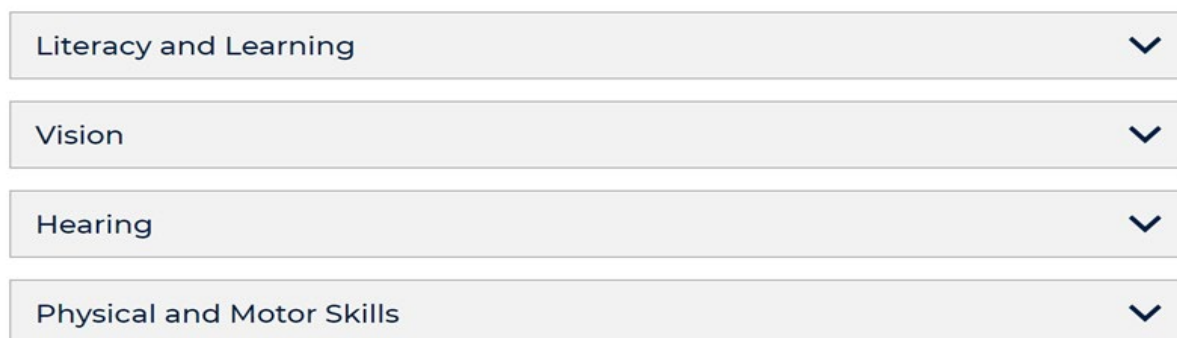
4. Alternatively use the search function - type in Cool Fun At Home to find these lessons

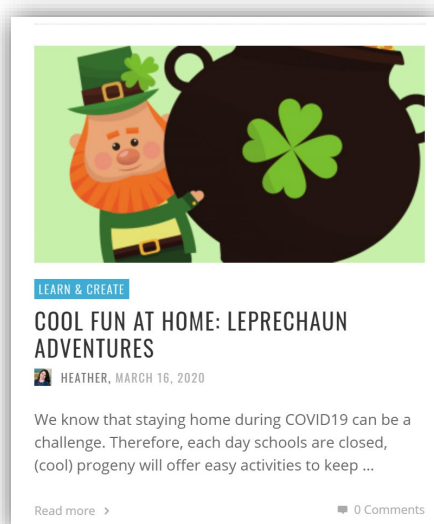

LEPRECHAUN ADVENTURES 

EXPLORE OUTSIDE	<p>SEARCH FOR LEPRECHAUNS. Grab a pair of binoculars (or decorate a paper towel roll to make a leprechaun looker) and head outside to look for leprechauns!</p> <p>DIY LEPRECHAUN OBSTACLE COURSE: Design a Leprechaun obstacle course. What types of things would a leprechaun have to do to find a pot of gold?</p>
LEARN	<p>WORD FUN: Brainstorm green words. What things are green? What words start with the letter G? Make a list or a collage of images. (<i>Preschoolers</i>)</p> <p>HISTORY LESSON: Head to Kids.NationalGeographic.com to learn about the origin of St. Patrick's Day and how people celebrate now. (<i>Elementary School</i>)</p>
CREATIVITY CHALLENGE	<p>MAKE A LEPRECHAUN TRAP: Make a leprechaun trap! Read a story like "<i>How to Catch a Leprechaun</i>" (available on Audible, too!) and then challenge your kids to make their own leprechaun traps. Need ideas? We have created a Pinterest Board.</p>
MOVE	<p>DANCE LIKE A LEPRECHAUN: Move like a leprechaun! Check out The Leprechaun Dance by The Kiboomers on YouTube or iTunes.</p> <p>LEARN AN IRISH JIG: Give Irish Dancing a try! Head to YouTube and try this intro to Irish Jig video.</p>

Each lesson has a range of different activities suitable for completing at home, also included are other webpage hyperlinks taking you to other suitable resources.

Underneath the lesson plan are simple ideas and details, for parents, on the activities and how to organise and run these.
