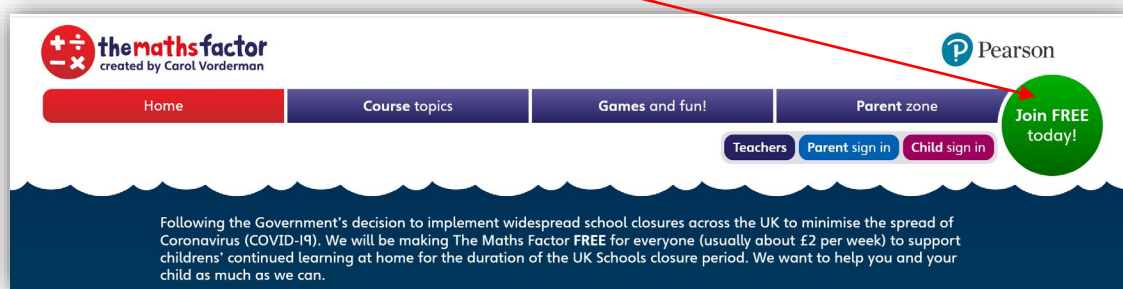

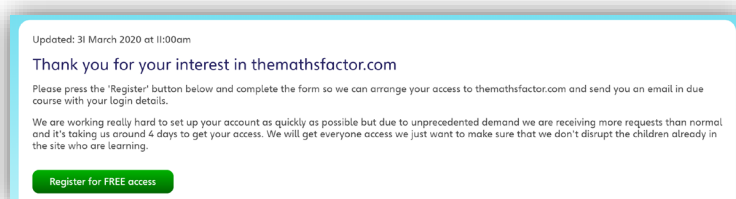

Course topics		The topic tree is divided into stages. In each tile there is a video, warm up and practice session leading to a certificate when they have mastered the skill.

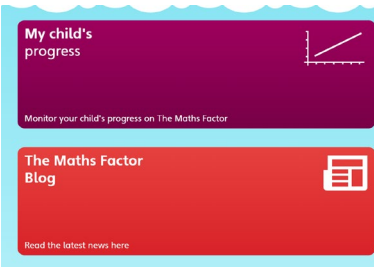
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Games and Fun
