Purpose of the Resource

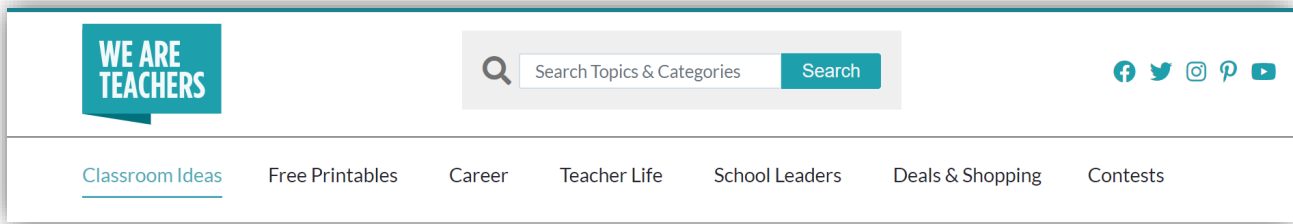

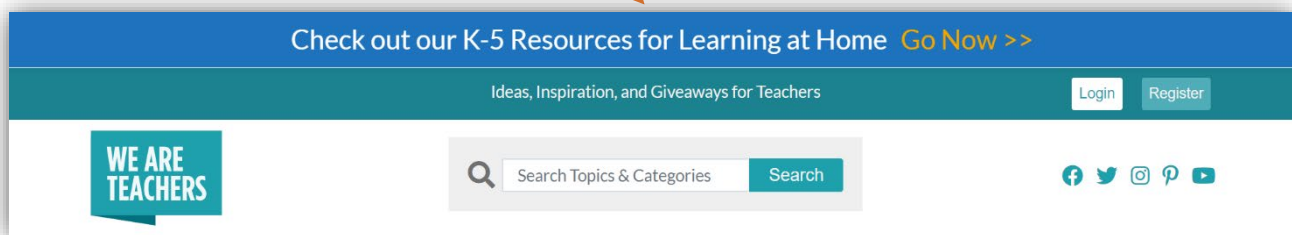

4. At the top of the page is a newly added banner K-5 Resources for Learning at Home. Click on this to access resources.

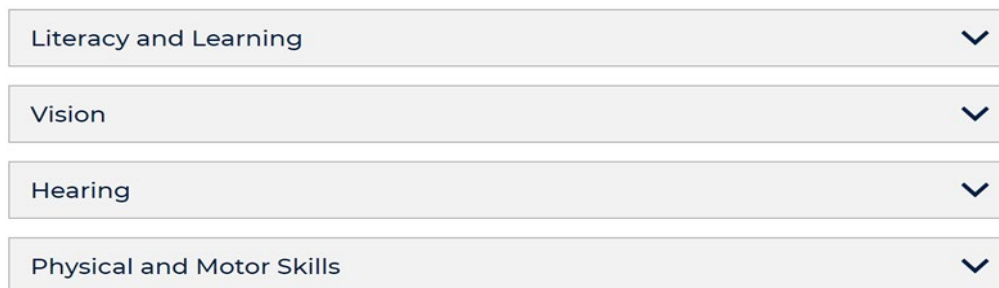


5. The other Menu items are components that are more appropriate for teachers.

Tips for parents and carers

The page has three sections

1. Top section is:-

Read-Alouds for Elementary School Kids

These authors are offering read-alouds of their books and books by *their* favorite authors.

2. Further down the page is:-

Virtual Author Activities for Middle School

Read-alouds and reading activities from favorite authors.

3. Final section is:-

Virtual Author Activities for High School & Young Adults

Even more resources for tweens and teens.

Users simply click on the author they wish to see, the link will take you to that author's own Instagram, Facebook or Webpage. From that site you can then select read-alouds, illustrations and others or activities.

Additional Information



There is a banner that links to Resources for Learning at home-K-5. This includes...

Websites – such as podcasts and science sites

Hands on Activities – links to science sites, online board games

Videos - educational Netflix shows, science videos, mathematics videos, poetry and Ted talk videos

Apps – reading apps and writing apps

Printable worksheets- literacy and numeracy worksheets
